ACCREDITATION FOR COACHES

COACH ACCREDITATION FREE ENTRANCE

- You present your valid photo ID card issued by Patinage Québec or your section

In order to receive accreditation from Skate Canada at Summer Championships, Skate Canada professional coaches must meet the following conditions:

- Must be "Regional Coach" certified or higher ;
- Be a current Professional Coaching Member of Skate Canada ;
- Hold a valid First Aid Certificate.

ALLOWED ENTRANCE – FEES: \$15

- You do not have your photo ID card issued by Patinage Québec or your section.
- Your name is on the list of coaches AND
 - You will have to present an ID card with photo, ex: health insurance card, driver license, etc...

If your name is not on the list, you will have to present:

- Photo ID card issued by Patinage Québec AND / OR if some of the dates are expired OR you have not received your card yet :
- Following documents :
 - Proof that you are registered and in good standing for 2017/2018
 - Proof of certification
 - Valid first aid card
 - Proof of the up-to-date BackCheck

ACCREDITATION MATRIX

The accreditation guidelines for all other Skate Canada sanctioned competitions (as applicable) are determined by the Sections.

Additional Considerations:

- Coaches who are in the process of achieving a [NCCP certification](#) may be considered for accreditation provided the necessary in-training or trained status as stipulated in the relevant NCCP coach pathway is achieved. Please note: the [NCCP coach pathways](#) are currently being revised to reflect the changes in this policy. We will notify you when this information has been updated on Info Centre.
- Non-resident coaches who do not coach in a Skate Canada club or skating school may be considered for accreditation provided that a valid screening is provided at time of competition entry and on-site at events.

MUSIC

Each skater or pair must provide two (2) CDR CDs (not CD-RW) when registering at least one (1) hour before the start of the event.

Norm for CDs:

- (1) There must be only one program per disc (on a single track).
- (2) It must be burned in audio format.
- (3) The name of the competitor, the category as well as the exact duration of the music must be indicated clearly.
- (4) MP3 format will not be accepted.
- (5) The discs must be presented in their protective cases.

Clean your discs well and ensure that they are not scratched in order to avoid any problems. For all questions concerning music, write to info@studiounisons.com.

VIDEO

Video orders will be taken directly at the competition site. HFT Communications will be on site.

PHOTO

Orders for action photos will be taken directly at the competition site.

AWARDS

Medals will be awarded to the top three (3) winners for each event. In the event that only two (2) competitors for one event, both competitors will receive an award. No medal will be given for a demonstration even if the event is judged.

At registration, only the competitor will receive a pass for the week-end. If a skater loses his pass, he will have to purchase another one at a cost of \$15.

Skate Canada, Patinage Québec and the local volunteers' team, assume no responsibility for any damage or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their registration, to these Championships, all competitors and their parents or guardians agree to assume all risks or injuries to the person or damage to the competitor's property resulting from the conduct and management of the competition, caused by these competitions or related thereto and hold any official complaint from officials, the association, the section, the volunteers team and their management. Registration of skaters will be accepted only under these conditions.

GENERAL RULES

JUDGING SYSTEM

The Cumulative Points Calculation (CPC) Judging System will be used for all event categories.

ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETITIONS

For all categories, the skaters have to be eligible persons according to rules of Skate Canada.

The skaters cannot register in two categories of the same discipline, for example: registering both in Juvenile Ladies Free and Pre-Novice Ladies combined will not be allowed.

Skaters do not have the possibility to register in one segment if they wish to. Participation in short program is mandatory to participate in the Free Program.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR ENTRY

- (1) **TEST PREREQUISITES:** Competitors wishing to enter Championnats Québécois d'été 2018 shall have passed the tests as listed in the Skate Canada Rule Book 2018-2019 Competition Program Requirements for each discipline before JUNE 21st preceding the Championships. A skater may also be considered qualified having passed a higher test or parts thereof as long as the minimum test requirement is fulfilled.
- (2) **AGE PREREQUISITES:** Competitors wishing to enter Championnats Québécois d'été and events leading to Sectionals shall meet the age requirements to compete as listed in the Skate Canada Rule Book 2018-2019 Competition Program Requirements for each discipline.

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 4 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Junior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 19 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 17 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Short program maximum 2 min. 30 sec.
and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(d) Pre-Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free style test or higher level.
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 16 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Short program maximum 2 min. 30 sec.
and Free program 3 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(e) Juvenile under 14 years of age

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free style test or higher level.
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 14 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(f) Pre-Juvenile under 11 years of age

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free style test or higher level.
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 11 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(2) SINGLE EVENTS FOR LADIES

(a) Senior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 4 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Junior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 19 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 17 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Senior Silver free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** No limit
- (iii) Short program maximum 2 min. 50 sec.

- (ii) **AGE:** Under 19 years of age for Ladies and under 21 years of age for Men as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) **Rythm** dance 2 min. 50 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free dance 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed two Gold dance tests or higher level.
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 19 years of age for Ladies and under 21 years of age for men as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Pattern Dance **Starlight waltz** and **Argentine Tango**.
and Free dance 3 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(d) Pre-Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Junior Bronze dance test or higher level.
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 18 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Pattern Dance **Harris Tango** and **Blues**.
and Free dance 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(e) Juvenile

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Junior Bronze dance test or higher level.
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 16 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Pattern Dance **Ten Fox**.
and Free dance 2 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(f) Pre-Juvenile "A"

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Junior Bronze dance test or higher level.
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 16 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Pattern Dance **Fiesta Tango**.
