ACCREDITATION FOR COACHES

Coaches must hold the minimum NCCP certification for each competition. The table showing the required level can be seen here: Accreditation Policy

FREE ENTRANCE WITH COACH ACCREDITATION

You have the coach photo ID card issued by Patinage Québec or your section.

ENTRANCE PERMITTED - \$15 FEES:

- You do not have the coach photo ID card issued by Patinage Québec or your section
- Your name is on the coach list AND
- You must present a photo ID card, ex: health insurance card, driver license, etc.

If your name is not on the coach list, you must present:

Coach photo ID card issued by Patinage Québec AND / OR if certain dates have expired OR you have not yet received your photo ID card:

- Present the following documents :
 - o Proof that you are registered and in good standing for the current season
 - Proof of certification
 - Valid first aid card
 - Proof of current BackCheck
 - o Proof that your "Respect in Sport" is up to date
 - o Proof that you have completed the online "Ethics Code" course

*** Coaches who do not produce all of the above required documentation will need to do so before obtaining accreditation or have their athletes represented by another coach

Number of coaches per athlete

Two coaches per competitor will be accredited. Only two people, chosen by the skater, pairs or team, will be admitted at the ice level.

During accreditation

Coaches must register in person and present their valid coach card with photo. It needs to be worn around their neck at all times.

If the \$15 fee has been paid and all documents provided, Patinage Quebec will provide a coloured bracelet that should be worn on the wrist or wrapped around lanyard with the ID card and displayed at all times.

If a coach is refused entrance (invalid)

The person in charge of the accreditation will advise the technical representative to ensure that access to changing rooms or rink side is denied for that coach.

MUSIC

Each skater or pair must provide two (2) CDR CDs (not CD-RW) when registering at least one (1) hour before the start of the event.

Standards for CDs:

- (1) There must be only one program per disc (on a single track).
- (2) It must be burned in audio format.
- (3) The name of the competitor, the category as well as the exact duration of the music must be indicated clearly.
- (4) MP3 format will not be accepted.
- (5) The discs must be presented in their protective cases.

Clean your discs well and ensure that they are not scratched in order to avoid any problems. For all questions concerning music, write to info@studiounisons.com.

VIDEO

Video orders will be taken directly at the competition site by HFT Communications.

AWARDS

Medals will be awarded to the top three (3) winners for each event. In the event that only two (2) competitors for one event, both competitors will receive an award. No medal will be given for a demonstration even if the event is judged.

ADMISSION FEE

ENTRY: 12 years older: \$10 per day PASSPORT: \$30 all events

5 to 11 years old: \$5 per day \$25 three days

Under 5 years old : free

At registration, only the competitor will receive a pass for the week-end. If a skater loses his pass, he will have to purchase another one at a cost of \$15.

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ACCIDENTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Skate Canada, Patinage Québec and the local volunteers' team, assume no responsibility for any damage or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their registration, to these Championships, all competitors and their parents or guardians agree to assume all risks or injuries to the person or damage to the competitor's property resulting from the conduct and management of the competition, caused by these competitions or related thereto and hold any official complaint from officials, the association, the Section, the volunteers team and their management. Registration of skaters will be accepted only under these conditions.

GENERAL RULES

JUDGING SYSTEM

The Cumulative Points Calculation (CPC) Judging System will be used for all event categories.

ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETITIONS

For all categories, the skaters have to be eligible persons according to rules of Skate Canada.

The skaters cannot register in two categories of the same discipline, for example: registering both in Juvenile Ladies Free and Pre-Novice Ladies combined will not be allowed.

Skaters do not have the possibility to register in one segment if they wish to. Participation in short program is mandatory to participate in the Free Program.

DRAW

Sub-groups Within a Warm-up Group

The order of skating for the final two warm-up groups will be drawn in four sub-groups (two sub-groups per warm-up group). If the number of competitors is not equally divisible, the second sub-group to skate will contain one more competitor than the first sub-group. Competitors placing higher will be placed in the later of the two sub-groups within a warm-up group. Within each sub-group a random draw for start order will occur.

All competitors placed into all additional warm-up groups will be drawn randomly.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR ENTRY

- (1) **TEST PREREQUISITES**: Competitors wishing to enter Championship must have passed the tests as listed in the Competition Program Requirements- <u>Competitive Rule</u> for each discipline before August 15, 2019 preceding the Championships. A skater may also be considered qualified having passed a higher test or parts thereof as long as the minimum test requirement is fulfilled.
- (2) AGE PREREQUISITES: Competitors wishing to enter Championship shall meet the age requirements to compete as listed in the <u>Competition Program Requirements- Competitive</u> Rule for each discipline.

(3) Single Events for Men

(a) Senior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Gold free style test.
- (ii) AGE: No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free program 4 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Junior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Gold free style test.
- (ii) AGE: Under 19 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Gold free style test.
- (ii) AGE: Under 17 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Short program maximum 2 min. 20 sec. (+/- 10 sec. and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.

(d) Pre-Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free style test or higher level.
- (ii) AGE: Under 16 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Short program maximum 2 min. 20 sec. (+/- 10 sec. and Free program 3 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(e) Juvenile under 14 years of age

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free style test or higher level.
- (ii) AGE: Under 14 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(4) Single events for ladies

(a) Juvenile under 12 years of age

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free style test or higher level.
- (ii) AGE: Under 12 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(5) Pair events

(a) Senior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Gold free style test.
- (ii) AGE: No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free program 4 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Junior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Gold free style test.
- (ii) AGE: No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the Senior Silver free style test or higher.
- (ii) AGE: No limit
- (iii) Short program maximum 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(d) Pre-Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free style test or higher level.
- (ii) AGE: Under 18 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Short program maximum 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free program 3 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(e) Juvenile

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free style test or higher level.
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 16 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(e) Pre-Juvenile

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free style test or higher level.
- (ii) AGE: Under 14 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(6) Dance events

(a) Senior

- (i) **TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the Gold A and Gold B Dance Assessments or higher.
- (ii) AGE: No limit
- (iii) Rythm Dance 2 min. 50 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free dance 4 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Junior

- (i) **TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the Gold A and Gold B Dance Assessments or higher.
- (ii) AGE: Under 19 years of age for Ladies and under 21 years of age for Men as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Rythm dance 2 min. 50 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free dance 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the complete STAR 8 (or equivalent) Dance Assessment or higher
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 19 years of age for Ladies and under 21 years of age for men as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Pattern Dance **Starlight waltz** and **Quickstep.** and Free dance 3 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(d) Pre-Novice

- (i) **TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the complete STAR 5 (or equivalent) Dance Assessment or higher.
- (ii) AGE: Under 18 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Pattern Dance **Starlight Waltz** and **Paso Doble.** and Free dance 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(e) Juvenile

- (i) TEST: At least one partner must have passed the complete STAR 5 (or equivalent) Dance Assessment or higher.
- (ii) **AGE:** Under 16 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Pattern Dance **Foxtrot.**and Free dance 2 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(f) Pre-Juvenile

- (i) **TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the complete STAR 5 (or equivalent) Dance Assessment or higher.
- (ii) AGE: Under 14 years of age as of July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Pattern Dance **Willow Waltz.** and Free dance 2 min. (+/- 10 sec.)
