## GENERAL INFORMATION

The 2022 Skate Canada Sectionals “B” – Québec Championships will be conducted in accordance with the [Skate Canada Competitive Rules](#). The non-qualifying categories of the sectional championships take place during this competition.

Rules governing Sectional championships also apply to any sub-sectional or other sectional elimination rounds unless otherwise stated in this announcement.

The realization of the 2022 Skate Canada Sectionals “B” - Québec Championships will be developed according to the sanitary rules and restrictions that will be in effect in the city of Laval in the province of Quebec in January 2022. **The vaccination passport will be mandatory for participants aged 13 and over, as of January 27, 2022.**

Patinage Québec may refuse the participation of certain skaters depending on the travel authorizations between regions and provinces that will be in effect at the time of the event.

## PURPOSE OF SECTIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Sectionals "B" Championships help to identify the top skaters in each section. Sectional “B” Championships is the first exposure to competitive stream competition for skaters and from a technical perspective is to be organized as closely as possible to the Canadian Championships in terms of rules and competitive experience.

The planning and execution of each Sectional Championship is delegated to the Section and/or its host committee with support from Skate Canada nationally, and the event is under the technical supervision of a technical representative assigned by the section.

Sectional "B" Championships allow the section to feature their talented skaters, train officials and volunteers, recognize sponsors, and provide entertaining skating for audiences at the provincial level.

## ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

Participants in the 2022 Skate Canada Section "B" – Québec Championships must meet the following criteria:

Entrants in Canadian Championships events, or qualifying events for Canadian Championships must:

- (1) Be a member in good standing of the Association.
- (2) **CANADIAN CITIZENSHIP:** Be Canadian citizens within the meaning of the Citizenship Act, RSC 1985. If the individual is not a Canadian citizen, such individual must have permanent resident status and have resided in Canada for at least one year prior to the date of the Championships they wish to enter. Also, if the entrant is of legal age, the entrant must file a declaration to indicate that he intends in good faith to become a Canadian citizen. If the entrant is an alien minor, he and the living parents (or guardians if both parents are deceased) must have also filed a sworn statement with the Chief Executive Officer of Skate Canada that said minor intends to become a citizen as soon as legally possible.

In the case of a skating or ice dancing pair, at least one of the two partners must be Canadian citizens. The other partner can be a citizen or resident of any other ISU member country and does not have to be resident in Canada.

All foreign citizens wishing to participate in Skate Canada qualifying competitions must complete the Foreign Citizen Application Form. To be eligible for these competitions, you must present an "acceptance" letter from the National Skate Canada office when registering for a qualifying competition for the season.

## CONDITIONS REQUIRED FOR REGISTRATION

- 1) **TESTS REQUIREMENTS:** Competitors wishing to compete in the Championships must have passed the tests listed in the [Skate Canada Competition Program Rules](#) or in the Patinage Québec Technical Requirements for Sans Limites by December 11, 2019. A skater who has passed a test or part of a higher test may also be considered eligible provided that the minimum test requirements are met.
- 2) **AGE REQUIREMENTS:** Competitors wishing to compete at the Championships must meet the age requirements set out in the [Skate Canada Competition Rules](#) or the [Patinage Québec Technical Requirements for Sans Limites](#) for each discipline.
- 3) **COMPETING IN SINGLES AT SECTIONALS:** A skater may compete in Singles events only in the Championships of the Section in which his home club/school is a member.

## ENTRY INFORMATION

Registration must be completed online via the following link: [Registration](#). All registrations and payments must be received at the latest **Wednesday, December 15, 2021 at 4:00 p.m.**

The registration fees must be paid online by credit card or Debit.

It is the skaters' responsibility to make sure they are eligible for the category they are registering for.

For refunds made before the registration deadline, Patinage Québec will deduct a 5% administration fee from the reimbursement, as well as a fee related to the online registration.

No change of group or category will be made after posting on the website.

**No refund will be authorized after the registration deadline.** It is the skaters' responsibility to make sure they are eligible for the category they are registering for.

## ENTRY FEES

Entry fees do not include service charges (1% (min \$ 1, max \$10)), administrative charges (2.5%.) And taxes.

## COACHES ACCREDITATION

**Coaches must have the minimum NCCP certification for the various competitions.**

**Scenario 1:** Please note that to receive free accreditation to the various competitions, you must:

- Present a **valid** Patinage Québec coach card.
  - **And** all additional dates on the card must be valid (ex: First Aid, Backcheck, etc.)

**Scenario 2:** You do not meet the conditions of scenario 1, you then must **pay \$15 to receive your accreditation** (for the duration of the competition) in the following cases:

- You have a valid Patinage Québec coach card, but one or more additional dates are not valid:
  - You must have with you the proof of renewal.
- You have a Patinage Québec coach card that is not valid:
  - You have with you the proof of Skate Canada membership for the current season (additional dates must be valid)
    - If the additional dates are not valid you must have with you the proof of renewal.
- You do not have a Patinage Québec coach card, but your name is on the coaches in good standing list.
- You do not have a Patinage Québec coach card, your name is not on the coaches in good standing list, but you have the following documents with you:
  - Proof of Skate Canada membership for the current season
  - Valid First Aid certificate
  - Backcheck certificate
  - « Respect in Sport » certificate
  - « Code of Ethics » certificate
  - **OR** a print screen of your Skate Canada profile with the proof of dates and certificates mentioned above.

**Scenario 3:** You do not meet the conditions of scenarios 1 or 2, **you will not be accredited** and will then have **to be replaced** with your athlete by a coach in good standing.

- **If the coach is refused entry (not in good standing), the person responsible for accreditation will notify the technical representative to ensure that access to changing rooms or rink side is denied for that coach.**

### **Number of caches with the athlete**

One coach per competitor / couple will be accredited. **Only one person, chosen by the skater, couple or team, will be allowed at ice level.**

Coaches must get accredited in person and present their coach card. They must wear the lanyard with the card around their neck at all times.

**A colored bracelet (provided by Patinage Québec for provincial competitions only) will be wrapped around the card lanyard OR on the coach's wrist if the payment of \$15 has been made (proof provided).**

If the coach is refused entry (not in good standing), the person responsible for accreditation will notify the technical representative to ensure that access to changing rooms or rink side is denied for that coach.

### **MUSIC**

All music used must be in the public domain or covered by the performing rights societies.

Competitors who have music composed specifically for their programs either wholly or in part, are responsible for obtaining a written release from the composer for the use of such music on radio and/or television or appropriate clearance from the performing rights societies.

**IMPORTANT:** The CD must be submitted when you register at the competition site.

### **Standard Specifications for CDs**

- (1) Only one program shall be recorded on each CD
- (2) They must be recorded in MUSIC (Audio) format.
- (3) Competitor's name followed by category, program type – short or free, and music time shall be shown on the CD label.
- (4) MP3 files won't be accepted.
- (4) Each CD shall be enclosed in a plastic case.

### **After the event:**

Athletes will be able to recuperate their CDs after the end of each event. Any CD that is not collected will not be returned.

### **VIDEO**

Videography company HFT Communications will be on site and filming the athletes during the competition. If you would like to purchase your children's video performance, you must purchase them from [Sportnroll](#) and we will email you the link, the week following your purchase.

## AWARDS

Standard Skate Canada Sectional medals will be presented to the top three finishers of each event. If only two competitors participate in the event, they will both receive a medal. If only one competitor is entered in the event, he will do a demonstration, but will not receive a medal. You will be able to obtain a copy of the medal presentation schedule at the time of registration.

Face covering is mandatory at all times for spectators, except when eating or drinking.

The vaccination passport is mandatory for all spectators aged 13 and older.

At accreditation, only the competitor will receive a pass for the weekend. If a competitor loses his pass, he will have to purchase another one at a cost of \$15.

Certified coaches according to requirements and members of Skate Canada will be admitted for free with their photo ID card (mandatory) and the vaccinal passport. They must wear their photo ID card and the bracelet around their neck at all times.

## COSTUMES

Clothing for all competitors should be modest, dignified and appropriate for competitive sport - not gaudy or theatrical in design. Accessories are prohibited.

## ACCIDENTS / LIABILITY

Skate Canada, Patinage Québec, and the volunteer team undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in these Championships, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by or connected with, the conduct and management of the competitions and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the association, the Section, Skate Canada, the volunteer team and against their officers; their entries shall be accepted only on these conditions.

## OTHER INFORMATION

### Camera Policy

Flash photography is not permitted. Skate Canada would encourage you to not use cameras or video equipment during Skate Canada organized events out of respect for the safety of competing athletes.

## **COVID-19**

The new coronavirus, COVID-19, has been declared a global pandemic by the World Health Organization (WHO). COVID-19 is extremely contagious and is believed to be spread primarily through person-to-person contact. Therefore, government authorities, both local, provincial and federal, are recommending various measures and prohibiting various behaviors, all with the aim of reducing the spread of the virus.

Specific measures will be sent to the participants of the Championships following their registration.

## **VACCINATION PASSPORT**

The procedures for validating the vaccination passport for skaters, spectators, volunteers, officials and coaches will be sent before the competition.

## **GENERAL REGULATIONS**

### **RATING SYSTEM**

The cumulative point system (CPC) is used for all events.

### **ELIGIBILITY FOR COMPETITIONS (Technical requirements)**

For all categories, competitors must be members in good standing of [Skate Canada](#).

Competitors may not participate in more than one category per discipline, for example: registering in Pre-Juvenile Ladies Free program and Juvenile Ladies Free program will not be allowed.

## **CONDITIONS REQUIRED FOR REGISTRATION**

- 4) **TESTS REQUIREMENTS:** Competitors wishing to compete in the Championships must have passed the tests listed in the [Skate Canada Competition Program Rules](#) or in the Patinage Québec Technical Requirements for Sans Limites by December 11, 2019. A skater who has passed a test or part of a higher test may also be considered eligible provided that the minimum test requirements are met.
- 5) **AGE REQUIREMENTS:** Competitors wishing to compete at the Championships must meet the age requirements set out in the [Skate Canada Competition Rules](#) or the [Patinage Québec Technical Requirements for Sans Limites](#) for each discipline.
- 6) **COMPETING IN SINGLES AT SECTIONALS:** A skater may compete in Singles events only in the Championships of the Section in which his home club/school is a member.

## **DRAW**

The method of draw for subsequent segments will be **by reverse order**.

#### SINGLE EVENT FOR MEN

**(a) JUVENILE (Under 14)**

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free skating test of higher.
- (ii) **ÂGE:** Competitors in the Juvenile category must be under the age of 14 on July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the competition. **Skate Canada allows an age extension for the 2021-2022 season.**
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

**(b) PRE-JUVENILE (Under 11)**

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free skating test or higher.
- (ii) **AGE:** Competitors in Pre-Juvenile category shall be under the age of 11 on July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the competition.
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

**(c) SANS-LIMITES UNDER 9 YEARS OF AGE**

- (i) **TEST:** No Restriction
- (ii) **AGE:** Competitors in Sans Limites shall be under the age of 9 on July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the competition.
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

#### SINGLE EVENT FOR WOMEN

**(a) JUVENILE (Under 14)**

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free skating test of higher.
- (ii) **ÂGE:** Competitors in the Juvenile category must be under the age of 14 on July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the competition. **Skate Canada allows an age extension for the 2021-2022 season.**
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

**(b) PRE-JUVENILE (Under 11)**

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free skating test or higher.
- (ii) **AGE:** Competitors in Pre-Juvenile category shall be under the age of 11 on July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the competition.
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

**(c) SANS-LIMITES UNDER 10 YEARS OF AGE**

- (i) **TEST:** No Restriction
- (ii) **AGE:** Competitors in Sans Limites under 10 single women category shall be under the age of 10 on July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the competition.
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

**(d) SANS-LIMITES UNDER 9 YEARS OF AGE**

- (i) **TEST:** No Restriction
- (ii) **AGE:** Competitors in Sans Limites under 9 single women category shall be under the age of 9 on July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the competition.
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

**(e) SANS-LIMITES UNDER 8 YEARS OF AGE**

- (i) **TEST:** No Restriction
- (ii) **AGE:** Competitors in Sans Limites under 8 single women category shall be under the age of 8 on July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the competition.
- (iii) Free program 2 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

**(f) SANS-LIMITES UNDER 7 YEARS OF AGE**

- (i) **TEST:** No Restriction
- (ii) **AGE:** Competitors in Sans Limites under 7 single women category shall be under the age of 7 on July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the competition.
- (iii) Free program 2 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

**PAIR EVENTS**

**(a) JUVENILE**

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free skating test or higher.
- AGE:** Competitors in the Pair Juvenile category shall be under the age of 16 on July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the competition. **Skate Canada allows an age extension for the 2021-2022 season.**
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

**(b) PRE-JUVENILE**

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free skating test or higher.
- AGE:** Competitors in Pair Juvenile category shall be under the age of 14 on July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the competition. **Skate Canada allows an age extension for the 2021-2022 season.**
- (iii) Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

**DANCE EVENTS**

**(a) JUVENILE**

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) Dance test or higher.
- AGE:** Competitors in the Dance Juvenile category shall be under the age of 17 on July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the competition. **Skate Canada allows an age extension for the 2021-2022 season.**
- (iii) Pattern dance **Fourteenstep et European**  
Free program 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

**(b) PRE-JUVENILE**

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) Dance test or higher.
- (ii) **AGE:** Competitors in the Dance Juvenile category shall be under the age of 14 on July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Pattern dance **Swing and Fiesta**  
Free program 2 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

**(c) SANS LIMITES**

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 1-3 (Preliminary) Dance test or higher.
- (ii) **AGE:** Competitors in the Dance Juvenile category shall be under the age of 14 on July 1st preceding the competition.
- (iii) Pattern dance **Canasta Tango and Baby Blues**
