ELIGIBILITY FOR COMPETITION (TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS)

Entrants in Canadian Championships events, or qualifying events for Canadian Championships must:

For all categories, the skaters must be member in good standing of [Skate Canada](#).

Competitors cannot participate in more than category per discipline for example: registering in Pre-Novice Ladies combined programs and Novice Ladies combined programs will not be allowed.

Skaters do not have the option of registering in a single segment if they wish. Participation in the Short Program is mandatory to access the Free Program.

ELIGIBILITY FOR COMPETITION

- 1) Be in good standing with the association.
- 2) **CANADIAN CITIZENSHIP:** Be Canadian citizens within the meaning of the Citizenship Act, RSC 1985. If the individual is not a Canadian citizen, such individual must have permanent resident status and have resided in Canada for at least one year prior to the date of the Championships they wish to enter. Also, if the entrant is of legal age, the entrant must file a declaration to indicate that he intends in good faith to become a Canadian citizen. If the entrant is an alien minor, he and the living parents (or guardians if both parents are deceased) must have also filed a sworn statement with the Chief Executive Officer of Skate Canada that said minor intends to become a citizen as soon as legally possible.

In the case of a pair or ice dance couple, at least one of the two partners must have Canadian citizenships. The other partner can be a citizen or resident of any other country member of ISU and does not have to reside in Canada.

All foreign citizens wishing to participate in **Skate Canada qualifying competitions** must complete the application Form for foreign citizens. To be eligible for these competitions, you must present a letter of "acceptance" from Skate Canada national office when registering for a qualifying competition for the season.

This form must be completed annually. The deadline each year is August 25th. For more information, please refer to [this page](#).

NON-CANADIAN CITIZEN APPLICATION

CONDITIONS REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION - ([Competitive Rule](#))

- 1) for non-qualifying competitions, competitors may upgrade in category without having to meet the testing requirements.
- 2) **AGE PREREQUISITES:** Competitors wishing to enter Championship shall meet the age requirements to compete as listed in the [Competition Program Requirements](#)- Competitive Rule for each discipline.

ENTRY INFORMATION

Registration must be completed online via [Registration](#). All registrations and payments must be received at the latest **Monday, June 20, 2022, at 4:00 p.m.**

Registration fees must be paid online by credit card or direct debit.

It is the responsibility of the skaters to ensure that they are eligible in the category in which they enter.

For refund made before the deadline, Patinage Québec will deduct from the refund, the administration fee of 5% as well as the fees relating to online registration.

No change of group or category will be possible after posting on the website.

No refund will be allowed after the registration deadline. It is the responsibility of the skaters to ensure that they are eligible for the category in which they register.

Entry Fees

Registration fees do not include service charges (1% (min \$1, max \$10)), administrative charges (2.5%) and taxes.

ACCOMMODATION

Please refer to the Patinage Québec website, www.patinage.qc.ca for hotel and reservation information, under "Compétitions" / "Compétitions provinciales".

COACHS ACCREDITATION

Coaches must have the minimum NCCP certification for each competition.

Scenario 1: Please note that to receive **free accreditation** for the different competitions, you need to:

- Present your **valid** Patinage Québec card.
 - **In addition**, all additional dates on the card must also be valid.
(Ex: First Aids, Back check, etc.)

Scenario 2: You do not meet the conditions of scenario 1, then you must **pay \$15 to receive your accreditation** (for the duration of the competition) in the following cases:

- You have a valid Patinage Québec coaching card but one or more additional dates are no longer valid:
 - You must have proof of updated credentials with you.
- You have a Patinage Québec card that is no longer valid:
 - You have proof of Skate Canada membership for the current season (additional dates must be valid).
 - In the event the additional dates are not valid, you must have proof of updated credentials with you.
- You do not have a Patinage Québec coaching card but your name is on the list of coaches in good standing.
- You do not have a Patinage Québec card, your name is not on the coaches in good standing list, but you have with you:
 - Proof of Skate Canada membership for the current season
 - Valid First Aids certificate
 - Back Check certificate
 - Respect in Sport certificate
 - Code of Ethics certificate
 - **OR** a print screen of your profile on Skate Canada website displaying the dates for proof of certificates mentioned above.

Scenario 3: You do not meet the conditions of scenarios 1 or 2, you **will not be accredited** and will then have **to be replaced** by your athlete by a coach in good standing.

- **If the coach is refused entry (not in good standing), the person responsible for accreditation will notify the technical representative so that this coach does not show up in the rooms or on the edge of the board.**

During accreditation

Coaches must register in person and present their valid coach card with photo. It needs to be worn around their neck at all times.

A coloured bracelet (provided by Patinage Québec for provincial competitions only) will be wrapped around the string of the card OR around the wrist of the coach if the payment of \$15 has been made (proof provided).

If entry is refused to the coach (not in good standing), the person responsible for accreditation will advise the technical representative so that this coach does not have access to the changing room or the board at ice level.

MUSIC

All music used must be in the public domain or covered by the performing rights societies.

Competitors who have music composed specifically for their programs either wholly or in part, are responsible for obtaining a written release from the composer for the use of such music on radio and/or television or appropriate clearance from the performing rights societies.

IMPORTANT: Mandatory delivery of CDs upon accreditation.

Standards for the delivery of CDs

- 1) There shall be only one program per CD.
- 2) They must be saved in MUSIC (Audio) format.
- 3) The name of the athlete followed by the category, the type of program – Short or Free, and the duration of the music must be clearly written on the CD label.
- 4) MP3 files are not accepted.
- 5) Discs shall be presented in their protective housings.

VIDEO

HFT Communications videography company will be on site. The procedure for purchasing the videos will be sent to participants by early July.

AWARDS

Medals will be awarded to the first three (3) in each category. When there are only two (2) participants in an event, both (2) participants will receive a medal. If only one participant is registered at the event, he will do a demonstration and won't receive a medal. A copy of the medal ceremony schedule will be available at accreditation.

Upon accreditation, only the competitor will receive a pass for the weekend. If the skater loses his pass, he will have to get another one at a cost of \$15.

Coaches certified according to Skate Canada requirements and members will be admitted free of charge upon presentation of the photo card (mandatory). They must always wear their card and the bracelet around their neck.

COSTUMES

Clothing for all competitors should be modest, dignified, and appropriate for competitive sport not gaudy or theatrical in design. Accessories are prohibited.

ACCIDENTS / LIABILITY

Skate Canada, Patinage Québec, CP des Deux Rives and the volunteer team undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in these Championships, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by or connected with, the conduct and management of the competitions and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the association, the Section, Skate Canada, the volunteer team and against their officers; their entries shall be accepted only on these conditions.

OTHER INFORMATION

Camera Policy

Flash photography is not permitted. Skate Canada would encourage you to not use cameras or video equipment during Skate Canada organized events out of respect for the safety of competing athletes.

COVID-19

Sanitary measures in place in Pierrefonds and/or Montreal and/or Quebec during the event will be those to be respected during the event. In addition, any indications contained in the Plan de relance could be in effect during the event.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

RATING SYSTEM

The cumulative point calculator (CPC) system is used for all events.

ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETITIONS (Technical requirements)

For all categories, competitors must be members in good standing of [Skate Canada](#).

Competitors cannot participate in more than [one category per discipline](#).

CONDITIONS REQUIRED FOR REGISTRATION

1) TESTING REQUIREMENTS: Competitors wishing to participate in Championships may upgrade categories without having to meet testing requirements.

2) AGE REQUIREMENTS: Competitors wishing to participate in the Championships must meet the age requirements set out in the [Skate Canada Competition Rules](#) for each discipline.

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 4 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Junior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** competitors must not have reached the age of 19 before July 1 preceding the competition.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** competitors must not have reached the age of 17 before July 1 preceding the event.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 20 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(d) Pre-Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free style test or a higher-level test.
- (ii) **AGE:** Pre-Novice Singles competitors must not have reached the age of 16 before July 1 preceding the event
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 20 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 3 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

Single events for WOMEN

(a) Senior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 4 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Junior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** competitors must not have reached the age of 19 before July 1 preceding the competition.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete the Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** competitors must not have reached the age of 17 before July 1 preceding the Event.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 20 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(d) Pre-Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free style test or a higher-level test.
- (ii) **AGE:** competitors must not have reached the age of 16 before July 1 preceding the event.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 20 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 3 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

Pair events

(a) Senior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 4 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Junior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the STAR 10 (Senior Silver) freestyle test.
- (ii) **AGE:** No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Pre-Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) free style test or a higher-level test.
- (ii) **AGE:** Pre-Novice Pairs competitors must not have reached the age of 18 before July 1 preceding the event.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free program 3 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

Ice Dance events

(a) Senior

- (i) **TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the Gold A and Gold B Dance Assessments or higher.
- (ii) **AGE:** No limit
- (iii) Rhythm Dance 2 min. 50 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free dance 4 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Junior

- (i) **TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the Gold A and Gold B Dance test or higher.
- (ii) **AGE:** Must meet ISU Junior age criteria (maximum age limit only applies: women must not have reached the age of 19 and men must not have reached the age of 21 before July 1 preceding the competition).
- (iii) Rhythm dance 2 min. 50 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
and Free dance 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the complete STAR 8 (Junior Silver) Dance test or higher.
- (ii) **AGE:** Women must not have reached the age of 19 and men must not have reached the age of 21 before July 1 preceding the competition.
- (iii) Pattern Dance: **Paso Doble** and **Viennese waltz**
and Free dance 3 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(d) Pre-Novice

- (i) **TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the complete STAR 5 (Junior Bronze) Dance test or higher.
- (ii) **AGE:** Pre-Novice Dance competitors must not have reached the age of 18 before July 1 preceding the event.
- (iii) Pattern Dance: **Rocker Foxtrot** and **Kilian**
and Free dance 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
