ELIGIBILITY FOR COMPETITION (TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS)

For all categories, the skaters must be member in good standing of <u>Skate Canada</u>.

Competitors cannot participate in more than <u>one category per discipline</u> for example: registering in Pre-Novice Ladies combined programs and Novice Ladies combined programs will not be allowed.

Skaters <u>do not have</u> the option of registering in a single segment if they wish. Participation in the Short Program is mandatory to access the Free Program.

ELIGIBILITY FOR COMPETITION

Participants at the Quebec Summer Championships events must meet the following criteria:

- 1) Be in good standing with the association.
- 2) <u>CANADIAN CITIZENSHIP</u>: Be Canadian citizens within the meaning of the Citizenship Act, RSC 1985. If the individual is not a Canadian citizen, such individual must have permanent resident status and have resided in Canada for at least one year prior to the date of the Championships

they wish to enter. Also, if the entrant is of legal age, the entrant must file a declaration to indicate that he intends in good faith to become a Canadian citizen. If the entrant is an alien minor, he and the living parents (or guardians if both parents are deceased) must have also filed a sworn statement with the Chief Executive Officer of Skate Canada that said minor intends to become a citizen as soon as legally possible.

In the case of a pair or ice dance couple, at least one of the two partners must have Canadian citizenships. The other partner can be a citizen or resident of any other country member of ISU and does not have to reside in Canada.

All foreign citizens wishing to participate **in Skate Canada qualifying competitions** must complete the application Form for foreign citizens. To be eligible for these competitions, you must present a letter of "acceptance" from Skate Canada national office when registering for a qualifying competition for the season.

This form must be completed annually. The deadline each year is August 25th. For more information, please refer to <u>this page</u>.

CONDITIONS REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION - (Competition Rules)

- 1) For non-qualifying competitions, competitors may upgrade in category without having to meet the testing requirements.
- 2) AGE PREREQUISITES: Competitors wishing to enter Championship shall meet the age requirements to compete as listed in the <u>Competition Program Requirements</u>- Competitive Rule for each discipline.

ENTRY INFORMATION

Registration must be completed online via <u>Registration</u>. All registrations and payments must be received at the latest <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>June 17</u>, 2025, at 4 p.m. Increased registration fees will apply to any registration completed after the deadline of Tuesday, June 17, 2025, as indicated in the table below. No registrations will be accepted after June 24, 2025, at 4:00 p.m. Registration fees must be paid online by credit card.

It is the responsibility of the skaters to ensure that they are eligible in the category in which they enter.

For refund made before the deadline, Patinage Québec will deduct from the refund, a 5% administration fee as well as the fees relating to online registration.

No change of group or category will be possible after posting on the website.

No refund will be allowed after the registration deadline.

ENTRY FEES

Registration fees do not include service charges, administrative charges and taxes.

COMPETITION SCHEDULE

ACCOMMODATION

Please refer to the Patinage Québec website, <u>www.patinage.qc.ca</u> for hotel and reservation information, under "Compétitions" / "Compétitions provinciales".

COACHS ACCREDITATION

Coaches must have the minimum NCCP certification for each competition.

- **Scenario 1**: Please note that to receive **free accreditation** for the different competitions, you must:
 - Present your **valid** Patinage Québec card.
 - <u>In addition</u>, all complementary dates must be valid on the competition accreditation list (e.g., first aid, criminal background check, Respect in Sport, Code of Ethics, etc.)
- <u>Scenario 2</u>: If you do not meet the conditions of Scenario 1, you must pay \$15 to receive accreditation (for the duration of the competition) in the following cases:
 - You have a valid Patinage Québec coaching card, but one or more complementary dates are no longer valid on the accreditation list:
 - You must have proof of updated credentials in hand (screenshot of your Skate Canada profile).
 - You do not have a Patinage Québec card, but your name appears on the list of coaches in good standing;
 - You do not have a Patinage Québec card, your name is not on the list of coaches in good standing, but you have in hand:
 - Proof of current season membership with Skate Canada;
 - Valid first aid certificate;
 - Criminal background check certificate;
 - Completion certificate for the Respect in Sport course;
 - Code of Ethics certificate
 - **OR** a screenshot from the Skate Canada website showing the dates of the above-mentioned proofs and certificates.
- <u>Scenario 3</u>: If you do not meet the conditions of Scenarios 1 or 2, you will not be accredited and must be replaced by a coach in good standing to accompany your athlete.
 - If a coach (not in good standing) is denied entry, the person responsible for accreditation will inform the technical representative so that the coach does not access the dressing rooms or the **rink side.**

Number of coaches with the athlete

Two coaches per skater/team or skating couple and two coaches per synchronized skating team will be accredited. Only these individuals will be allowed at ice level.

During accreditation

Coaches must register in person and present their valid coach card with photo. The coach card must be worn around their neck at all times.

A coloured bracelet (provided by Patinage Québec for provincial competitions only) will be wrapped around the card's lanyard OR around the coach's wrist if the payment of \$15 has been made (proof provided).

MUSIC

All music used must be legally obtained and covered by the collective societies who manage music performance rights, reprography, and mechanical reproduction rights in Canada. Competitors who have music composed specifically for their programs either wholly or in part, that has been significantly mixed or altered from the original recording, are also responsible for obtaining the appropriate licenses to create a derivative work for the compositions and sound recordings selected.

Patinage Québec assumes no responsibility for the unauthorized use of copyrighted music. By submitting their music, participants acknowledge that they have secured all required permissions and agree to indemnify Patinage Québec against any claims or legal actions arising from the use of said music.

IMPORTANT: Music deposit required on SPLEX.

Competitors must ensure that they have a CD or USB flash drive with them at the rink side, in case of technical problems with the music file that has been uploaded to SPLEX. Cell phones or MP3 files will not be accepted. It is possible to make modifications to your music file directly in SPLEX. The deadline for modifications is July 22, 2025. No files will be downloaded from the platform after this date. In the event of music modification after this date, it is essential to hand in CDs and mention to accreditation that there has been a music change, as the download will take precedence over the CDs.

Standard Specifications for CDs

- (1) Only one program must be recorded on each CD
- (2) They must be recorded in MUSIC (Audio) format. The file must be in .WAV format.
- (3) Competitor's name followed by category, program type short or free, and music time must be clearly marked on the CD label.
- (4) Cell phones or MP3 files <u>will not be</u> accepted.
- (4) Each CD must be enclosed in their protective case.

It's important to clean your CDs and make sure they are not scratched to avoid reading problems.

Athletes will be able to recuperate their CDs after the end of each event. Any CD that is not collected will not be returned.

VIDEOS

HFT Communications will be on hand to film the athletes during the competition. The registration fee includes the videos. A link will be sent to participants to download their videos. Please allow at least 48 hours before the link is sent.

AWARDS

Medals will be awarded to the first three (3) in each category. When there are only two (2) participants in an event, both (2) participants will receive a medal. If only one participant is registered at the event, he will receive a medal. A copy of the medal ceremony schedule will be available at accreditation.

ADMISSION

Spectator admission is free for this event.

COSTUMES

Clothing for all competitors should be modest, dignified, and appropriate for competitive sport not gaudy or theatrical in design. Accessories are prohibited.

ACCIDENTS / LIABILITY

Skate Canada, Patinage Québec, Figure Skating club des Deux-Rives and the volunteer team undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in these Championships, all competitors and their parents or guardians agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by or connected with, the conduct and management of the competitions and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the association, the Section, Skate Canada, the volunteer team and against their officers; their entries will be accepted only on these conditions.

OTHER INFORMATION

Camera Policy

Flash photography is not permitted. Skate Canada would encourage that you not use cameras or video equipment during Skate Canada organized events out of respect for the safety of competing athletes.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

RATING SYSTEM

The cumulative point calculator (CPC) system is used for all events.

DRAW

The method of draw for subsequent segments will be <u>in reverse order</u>. Junior athletes will be divided into groups according to their national ranking.

SINGLE EVENTS FOR MEN

- (a) Senior
 - (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
 - (ii) AGE: No limit
 - (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free program 4 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Junior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
- (ii) AGE: Competitors must not have reached the age of 19 before July 1 preceding the competition.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
 and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
- (ii) AGE: Competitors must not have reached the age of 17 before July 1 preceding the event.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 20 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
 and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(d) Pre-Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 6 (or equivalent) free style test or a higher-level test.
- (ii) AGE: Pre-Novice Singles competitors must not have reached the age of 16 before July 1 preceding the event.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 20 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free program 3 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

SINGLE EVENTS FOR WOMEN

- (a) Senior
 - (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
 - (ii) **AGE:** No limit
 - (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)and Free program 4 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Junior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
- (ii) AGE: Competitors must not have reached the age of 19 before July 1 preceding the event.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
 and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete the Gold free style test.
- (ii) AGE: competitors must not have reached the age of 17 before July 1 preceding the event.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 20 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(d) Pre-Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 6 (or equivalent) free style test or a higher-level test.
- (ii) AGE: Competitors must not have reached the age of 16 before July 1 preceding the event.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 20 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free program 3 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

PAIR EVENTS

(a) Senior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
- (ii) **AGE:** No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
 - and Free program 4 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Junior

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Gold free style test.
- (ii) AGE: No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
 and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have completed the STAR 10 (or equivalent) freestyle test or a higher level test.
- (ii) AGE: No limit
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)and Free program 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Pre-Novice

- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete STAR 6 (or equivalent) free style test or a higher-level test.
- (ii) AGE: Pre-Novice Pairs competitors must not have reached the age of 18 before July 1 preceding the event.
- (iii) Short program 2 min. 40 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free program 3 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

ICE DANCE EVENTS

- (a) Senior
 - (i) **TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the Gold A and Gold B Dance test or higher.
 - (ii) **AGE:** No limit
 - (iii) <u>Rhythm Dance</u>: 2 min. 50 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free dance 4 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(b) Junior

- (i) **TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the Gold A and Gold B Dance test or higher.
- (ii) AGE: Competitors must not have reached the age of 21 before July 1 preceding the event.
- (iii) <u>Rhythm dance</u>: 2 min. 50 sec. (+/- 10 sec.) and Free dance 3 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

(c) Novice

- (i) **TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the complete STAR 8 (or equivalent) Dance test or higher.
- (ii) AGE: Competitors must not have reached the age of 21 before July 1 preceding the event.
- (iii) <u>Pattern Dance:</u> Quickstep (4 seq) and Argentine Tango (2 seq) and Free dance 3 min. (+/- 10 sec.)

(d) Pre-Novice

- (i) **TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the complete STAR 6 (or equivalent) Dance test or higher.
- (ii) AGE: Pre-Novice Dance competitors must not have reached the age of 18 before July 1 preceding the event.
- (iii) <u>Pattern Dance:</u> **Tango** (2 seq) and **Blues** (3 seq). and Free dance 2 min. 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)
