PURPOSE OF SECTIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Quebec Section Adult 2026 Skating Championships identify the top Adult skaters in the province.

ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE (TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS)

For all categories, competitors must be [Skate Canada members](#) in good standing.

Competitors may not participate in more than [one category per discipline](#), e.g.: entering Adult Bronze free program and Adult Silver free program will not be permitted.

For synchronized skating, the Club may register teams in more than one Event Category provided that, for each new Category in which they are entered, they replace at least 50% of the skaters (the calculation does not include substitutes) and present a different program to different music.

ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

Participants in the Quebec Section Adult 2026 Skating Championships section must meet the following criteria:

- (1) Be a member in good standing of the Association.
- (2) **CANADIAN CITIZENSHIP:** Canadian citizens under the 1985 Citizenship Act or, if foreign subjects, permanent residents who have been resident in Canada for at least one year prior to the date of the championship in which they wish to participate. If the participant is of legal age, he/she must sign, in good faith, his/her intention to become a Canadian citizen. If the participant is not Canadian and is a minor, he and his parents (or guardians if both parents are deceased) must sign, under oath, with the Skate Canada Chief Executive Officer, a declaration indicating his intention to become a citizen as soon as legally possible.

In the case of a skating or ice-dancing couple, at least one partner must be a Canadian citizen. The other partner may be a citizen or resident of any other ISU member country and need not reside in Canada.

All foreign citizens wishing to participate in Skate Canada qualifying competitions must complete [the Foreign Citizen Application Form](#). To be eligible for these competitions, you must present a letter of "acceptance" from the Skate Canada National Office when you register for a qualifying competition of the season.

REPLACEMENT (Synchronized skating only)

There may be a maximum of four (4) substitutes per team in all categories.

Problems that may arise during a performance :

The technical representative or his designated substitute (ice level referee) may ask a team substitute to pick up any object that has fallen on the ice (hair accessory or other), thus ensuring the safety of the skaters without having to interrupt the program. To this end, it is requested that, where possible, all teams place a substitute on skates, without blade guards, near the rink entrance during the presentation of the team's program.

CONDITIONS REQUIRED FOR REGISTRATION

- (1) **TEST REQUIREMENTS :** Competitors wishing to participate in the Championships must have passed the tests listed in the [Skate Canada Competition Program Rules](#) before **January 1, 2026**. A skater who has passed a test or part of a higher test may also be considered eligible, provided he/she meets the minimum test requirements.
- (2) **AGE REQUIREMENTS :** Competitors wishing to participate in the Championships must meet the age requirements stipulated in the Skate Canada Competition Rules for each discipline.
- (3) **PARTICIPATION IN SINGLES EVENTS AT SECTIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS:** A competitor may only take part in the singles events of the championships of the section of which his or her club/school is a member.

ENTRY INFORMATION

Immediately after the results of your regional final are posted, qualified participants must confirm their participation in the Quebec Section Adult 2026 Skating Championships to the regional representatives, who will inform them of the procedure to follow and collect the information needed to register for the provincial final, as well as the cost of affiliation.

Depending on the number of registration available, from Thursday February 19, 2026 4:00 PM to Thursday February 26, 2026 4:00 PM, we will accept competitors from Ontario and New Brunswick. **Due to a high number of registrations only the competitors from the province of Quebec, will be able to register for the competition**

All entries and payments must be received before **Thursday, February 12rd 2026 at 4 pm. (HNE (UTC-04:00))**. **Increased registration fees will apply to any registration completed after the deadline of Thursday, February 19, 2026, as indicated in the table below.**

The registration fees must be paid online by credit card.

For refunds made before the registration deadline, Patinage Québec will deduct from the refund a 5% administration fee as well as the online registration fee.

No group or category changes will be made after posting on the website.

No refunds will be authorized after the registration deadline. It is the skater's responsibility to ensure that they are eligible for the category in which they are registering.

ENTRY FEES

Entry fees do not include service charges (1% (min \$ 1, max \$10)), administrative charges (2.5%.) and taxes.

Example for a 2-event entry: An adult skater can enter both Interpretive and Freestyle.

Registration for skaters, officials and coaches will begin one hour prior to the events. Registration takes place on site.

COACHES ACCREDITATION

Coaches must be certified Regional coaches, be members in good standing of Skate Canada and hold a professional coach card issued by Skate Quebec.

Scenario 1: Please note that to receive **free accreditation** for the different competitions, you must:

- Present your **valid** Patinage Québec card.
 - **In addition**, all complementary dates must be valid on the competition accreditation list (e.g., first aid, criminal background check, Respect in Sport, Code of Ethics, etc.)

Scenario 2: If you do not meet the conditions of Scenario 1, **you must pay \$15 to receive accreditation (for the duration of the competition)** in the following cases:

- You have a valid Patinage Québec coaching card, but one or more complementary dates are no longer valid on the accreditation list:
 - You must have proof of updated credentials in hand (screenshot of your Skate Canada profile).
- You do not have a Patinage Québec card, but your name appears on the list of coaches in good standing;
- You do not have a Patinage Québec card, your name is not on the list of coaches in good standing, but you have in hand:
 - Proof of current season membership with Skate Canada;
 - Valid first aid certificate;
 - Criminal background check certificate;
 - Completion certificate for the Respect in Sport course;
 - Code of Ethics certificate
 - **OR** a screenshot from the Skate Canada website showing the dates of the above-mentioned proofs and certificates.

Scenario 3: If you do not meet the conditions of Scenarios 1 or 2, **you will not be accredited and must be replaced by a coach in good standing** to accompany your athlete.

- If a coach (not in good standing) is denied entry, the person responsible for accreditation will inform the technical representative so that the coach does not access the dressing rooms or the **rink side**.

Number of coaches with the athlete

Two coaches per skater/team or skating couple and two coaches per synchronized skating team will be accredited. Only these individuals will be allowed at ice level.

During accreditation

Coaches must register in person and present their valid coach card with photo. The coach card must be worn around their neck at all times.

A coloured bracelet (provided by Patinage Québec for provincial competitions only) will be wrapped around the card's lanyard OR around the coach's wrist if the payment of \$15 has been made (proof provided).

TEAM MANAGERS AND CHAPERONES

Team managers and chaperones must be currently registered members of Skate Canada, in accordance with the Accreditation Policy.

Accreditation is granted to two coaches, one team manager and one chaperone, for a total of four people per team. The names and Skate Canada numbers of accredited individuals **MUST** appear on the online registration page under Participating Personnel.

If the team has two coaches, the main coach and one replacement (a skater) stand at the rink entrance, while the second coach and other replacements stand at the rink exit (in the area reserved for hugs and tears). In the event that the team has only one coach, the main coach and one substitute (a skater) stand at the rink entrance while the team manager stands at the rink exit (in the area reserved for hugs and tears).

The accompanying person has access to the dressing rooms **ONLY**; he/she is not allowed on the ice during training sessions and competition (including the area reserved for hugs and tears).

MUSIC

All music used must be legally obtained and covered by the collective societies who manage music performance rights, reprography, and mechanical reproduction rights in Canada. Competitors who have music composed specifically for their programs either wholly or in part, that has been significantly mixed or altered from the original recording, are also responsible for obtaining the appropriate licenses to create a derivative work for the compositions and sound recordings selected.

Patinage Québec assumes no responsibility for the unauthorized use of copyrighted music. By submitting their music, participants acknowledge that they have secured all required permissions and agree to indemnify Patinage Québec against any claims or legal actions arising from the use of said music.

IMPORTANT : Music files must be uploaded to SPLEX upon registration.

Competitors must ensure to carry a copy of their music on CD or USB memory stick and have it available at rink side as backup should a technical problem arise with the music file uploaded on the SPLEX platform.

No files will be downloaded from the platform after February 24 2026. In case of a music change after this date, it is important to provide CDs for accreditation and mention that there has been a music change, as the download will take precedence over the CDs.

Standard Specifications for CDs

- (1) Only one program must be recorded on each CD
- (2) They must be recorded in MUSIC (Audio) format .
- (3) Competitor's name followed by category, program type – short or free, and music time must be shown on the CD label.
- (4) **Cellular phones, USB memory stick or MP3 files** will not be accepted.
- (5) Each CD must be enclosed in a plastic case.

It's important to clean your CDs and make sure they are not scratched to avoid reading problems.

Athletes will be able to recuperate their CDs after the end of each event. Any CD that is not collected will not be returned.

VIDEO

An assigned representative will be present to film the athletes during the competition. The registration fee includes the videos. A link will be sent to participants to download their videos. Please allow at least 48 hours to receive the link.

AWARDS

Medals will be presented to the top three competitors of each event. If only two competitors participate in the event, they will both receive a medal. If only one competitor participates in the event, he/she will receive a medal. You will be able to obtain a copy of the medal presentation schedule at the time of registration.

ENTRY FEE

There is no admission charge for spectators at this event.

COSTUMES

Clothing for all competitors should be modest, dignified and appropriate for competitive sport - not gaudy or theatrical in design. Accessories are prohibited.

ACCIDENTS / LIABILITY

Skate Canada, Patinage Québec, and the volunteer team undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in these Championships, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by or connected with, the conduct and management of the competitions and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the association, the Section, Skate Canada, the volunteer team and against their officers; their entries shall be accepted only on these conditions.

OTHER INFORMATION

Camera Policy

Flash photography is not permitted. Skate Canada would encourage you to not use cameras or video equipment during Skate Canada organized events out of respect for the safety of competing athletes.

ELIGIBILITY FOR EVENTS WITHOUT REGIONAL QUALIFICATIONS – ADULT CATEGORIES

ELIGIBILITY

Competitors must be members in good standing of [Skate Canada](#).

Category requirements

Skaters are expected to skate to their ability and enter the appropriate Category based on the competition program requirements.

Competitors must be 18 years of age on July 1st of the current year. Skaters are not allowed to register in two categories of the same discipline (example Bronze and Silver in single).
